Over the last couple of months, the staff in school have been busy looking at the curriculum we teach and developing ways to enhance the teaching and learning going on in class. We have reorganised some of the topics we teach so that over the year, Key Stage One classes will cover 5 topics and Key Stage Two will look at four different topics. Through this, we are ensuring that all objectives from the National Curriculum are covered and the children will continue to develop a 'deep learning' mindset.

We have already spoken to the children about this and explained that their projects should continue to be exciting, informative and creative.
