Our **<u>TOPIC</u>** this half-term is **School Days**.

During the topic the children will:

- Compare modern day school and schools in the past, identifying similarities and differences.
- Look at their local environment and identify the key features of the school.
- Be able to identify and describe differences between old and new schools.
- Know by heart a range of playground songs and rhymes.
- Identify and name a variety of common plants, including garden plants, wild plants and trees.

<u>PE</u>

PE will be on **Friday for children in Holly Class and Sequoia class**. This half term we will be focusing on developing our ball skills and taking part in a variety of playground games.

Children should come to school wearing their PE kits on Friday. As with all uniform, please ensure that items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name on it.

PE kit is a plain white t-shirt and blue shorts. As the weather is becoming cooler, we recommend that children wear blue tracksuit bottoms, with their school sweatshirt and suitable footwear as we will be doing PE outdoors as much as possible.

School Days

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we will be focusing on number and place value and practicing counting to and across 100, forwards and backwards. We will also be counting in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s. We will then move onto adding and subtracting numbers using number bonds and subtraction facts within 20. Later on in the term, we will solve practical problems involving length and weight.

<u>English</u>

To begin with, we will be carrying out an exciting whole school English project. The book we are using is a lovely aid for transition as its themes are an important representation of what we are experiencing at the minute. We will then move on to describe differences between modern day schools and schools of the past with a focus on descriptive language. We will be using the text 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson as a stimulus for a number of reading, writing and speaking and listening opportunities.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, we will identify and name a variety of common plants, including garden plants, wild plants and trees. We will also be exploring the plants in our environment and around the school. We will learn the terms 'deciduous' and 'evergreen' and use these to classify plants and trees.

Creative Development

In our Art lessons, we will draw and paint our self-portraits, selecting appropriate colours and adding detail to our work. We will look at the work of L.S. Lowry and create a pastel picture of the school in a similar style. In Geography, we will look at our local environment and identify key features of the school. In Design and Technology, we will be designing and building our ideal school.

<u>RE and Circle Time</u>

In RE we will be offering children the opportunity to see themselves as valued individuals within a community. Children will be able to talk about themselves and their lives.

During Circle Time, we will be focusing on the children's health and wellbeing by discussing the children's hopes about the new school year and addressing any fears they may have about returning to school. We will also be helping the children to develop a growth mind set. This encourages the children to become resilient in their learning by challenging themselves and understanding that it is okay to make mistakes.
