Our <u>TOPIC</u> this half-term is **Yes Minister**. During the topic the children will:

- Use different sources of research to find out about parliament.
- · Understand and describe the role of MPs.
- Take part in debates around key issues affecting the UK.
- Understand the Suffragettes and their impact on our voting system.
- Take part in a class election.

PE

PE will be on **Thursday**. This half term we will be focusing on developing our ball skills and taking part in a variety of competitive games.

Children should come to school wearing their PE kits on Thursday. As with all uniform, please ensure that items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name on it.

PE kit is a plain white t-shirt and blue shorts. As the weather is becoming cooler, we recommend that children wear blue tracksuit bottoms, with their school sweatshirt and suitable footwear as we will be doing PE outdoors as much as possible.

Maths

During the first part of this half term our maths lessons will focus on fractions, decimals and percentages. We will then move on to look. at measures. The children will learn to read, write and convert measures including length, mass, volume and time.

English

To begin with, we will be carrying out an exciting whole school English project. The book we are using is a lovely aid for transition as its themes are an important representation of what we are experiencing at the minute. Year 6 will also continue to work on the structure of their writing, including punctuation, writing for different genres and contexts. The children will write manifestos for their political parties and write and deliver speeches.

Science

Our science topic this half-term is Light. Children will learn that light travels in straight lines and that we see objects because they give out or reflect light into our eyes. We will also research how a sun dial can be used to tell the time.

Creative Development

In our Art lessons, we will be developing our skills in using oil pastels. Children will evaluate different representations of The Houses of Parliament and then recreate Monet's version in their own style.

RE

Our first RE topic this year is Moral Maze. This unit will give children the opportunity to hear about people of faith and the dilemmas they have faced. Different religions offer believers support and teaching whilst they are considering the solution to a dilemma. The children will have the opportunity to consider some moral dilemmas and explain how they would solve them.

Circle Time

During Circle Time, we will be focusing on the children's health and wellbeing by discussing the children's hopes about the new school year and addressing any fears they may have about returning to school. This will be supported with discussions about what is happening within the community and supporting the children to understand the effects of Coronavirus on the community and world. We will also be reminding the children of their growth mind set and thinking about the type of learner they are and how to make the most of their learning time.
