During the topic the children will:

- Use maps, atlases and globes to locate different countries, including arctic regions.
- Name and locate the world's continents.
- Explain how animals and people adapt to their environment.
- Locate the equator and explain how it affects climate.
- Use different sources of research e.g. books, pictures, photographs and the internet.



PE will be on <mark>Friday</mark> for children in <mark>Holly Class</mark> and on Thursday for Children in <mark>Sequoia</mark> class.

This half term we will be focusing on Dance and will be exploring body shapes and movements to express our dance ideas.

PE will take place in the hall and children should wear navy or black shorts and a plain white t-shirt. As children are still coming to school in their PE kit, they should also wear navy blue tracksuit bottoms or leggings with a school jumper and a coat to keep warm at playtimes and lunchtimes.

<u>Maths</u>

This term we will be exploring addition and subtraction and using different methods to solve number problems. This includes using number bonds and subtraction facts within 20. We will then move onto recognising and naming 2D and 3D shapes. Finally we will begin our work on fractions by recognising, finding and naming a half and a quarter of shapes, objects and quantities.

<u>English</u>

This term we are starting a new and exciting topic- Poles Apart! We will be learning all about penguins and will be using the text The Emperors Egg by Martin Jenkins as a stimulus for lots of reading and writing opportunities. These will range from using question marks for the first time to producing fact files and poetry. We will also continue to have our daily phonics and reading sessions.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, we will be learning about changes across the four seasons in the United Kingdom, particularly associated with weather, day length, temperature and living things. We will identify the ways animals and humans adapt to their environment in hot and cold climates.

Creative Development

In Art, we will be using a range of painting techniques and media to create a representation of the Northern Lights. We will also be building a home suitable for penguins in our classroom.

<u>RE and Circle Time</u>

In RE, we will look at celebrations and explore the ways in which different people mark special occasions in the life of their families and communities.

During Circle Time, we will be celebrating the similarities and differences between the people in our class and reminding ourselves that we are all special and unique.
