Each class has chosen an article to work on; exploring and learning about their rights and how these rights are available to them. They have designed their right respecting buildings on the JHP school street.




UNICEF Assembly for Parents

Parents and governors were kept informed about the school's commitment to the principles of the UNCRC, they were invited to the UNICEF exhibition held by a steering group more explicitly so that they have a greater awareness of the UNCRC and how this influences our school and children.

September 2020: Class Charters

The children chose their favourite and most relevant articles to replace the classroom rules. These new "Class Charters" include ways in which adults around school will fulfil their responsibility in ensuring the rights of each child met.

All classes have a display dedicated to the class charter and UNICEF Rights Respecting Information. This is activity linked to Article 28: Every child has the right to a good education.

October 2020: Each class celebrated the Black History Month with an Art project. They have chosen an inspirational artist from a significant people from minority cultures or backgrounds and designed a poster. All children were given a 16cm square canvas to design and decorate with a focus on the UNCRC.
