Lessons through Google Classrooms in the morning on Thursday 6th May.

Maths

This term, we will be learning to tell the time on an analogue clock looking at o'clock and half past times. This will also include measuring time in hours, seconds and minutes.

We will be measuring weight and mass and capacity and volume and writing these measurements down. We will also be exploring movement, position and direction. This will include talking about whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

Finally, we will be revisiting our learning about money and looking at the value of different coins and notes. Children will begin to use the p and £ sign and use coins to make a particular amount.

English

The children will take part in a range of class discussions using specific vocabulary linked to our topic to explain and describe their ideas. We will-read and research information about the Montgolfier brothers and the Wright Brothers in order to write non-fiction texts.

The children will read the story Man on the Moon (a day in the life of Bob) by Simon Bartram. This humorous book introduces the reader to Bob who has the very special job of looking after the moon. It also supports learning about setting, character and plot development and offers children a good stimulus for their own descriptive writing, story writing and writing of simple non-fiction texts.

Science

This term, the children will be learning about animals. They will be identifying and naming a variety of animals including birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians and mammals. They will also be looking at the basic features of each of these groups and identifying which are herbivores, carnivores and omnivores.

Topic

In our topic lessons the children will:

- learn how a hot air balloon works.
- imagine what it is like to ride in a hot air balloon.
- be able to recall information about the first ever flight and the jet era.
- learn about the set up and roles in an airport.
- use atlases and maps to locate countries around the world.

Art

The children will learn to recognise and interpret impressionist art, looking at the work of Monet and creating paintings inspired by impressionism.

RE

We will be learning about the religion of Islam. The children will be learning about Muslim beliefs and celebrations and important religious symbols. The children will have the opportunity to retell some Muslim stories and explore the meaning associated with them.

PSHE

Our PSHE topic is 'Relationships.' The children will explore the relationships they have with their family and friends. We will learn about the different types of family and thinking about the qualities of a good friend.
