



# Welcome Back

Welcome back, you will have received a message from me last week to say that this newsletter had been delayed so that we could wait to hear what the Government announced about wider opening on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> June.

Unfortunately as expected further opening has been put back and with increasing cases of the Delta variant of Covid 19 in Waltham Forest and in schools there has been no change to school practice or our risk assessment. Therefore we continue with children remaining in class bubbles, staggered lunchtimes and staggered end times keeping the 10 minute opening times. This means as well that parents and carers should remember not to gather at the school gates, maintain social distancing and the rule of 6 people meeting up indoors still applies. Classes will still be asked to self-isolate at home if there is a positive case confirmed in your child's class which unfortunately has already had to happen in 6 Primary Schools across Waltham Forest in the last week.

The rise in cases in Waltham Forest also impacts on Year 6 transition days to Secondary schools unfortunately. The secondary schools are currently discussing with the LA about moving transition online and we will let Year 6 parents know as soon as possible of any changes. This may change from school to school and Local Authority

At the end of this newsletter I have included the calendar dates for the Academic Year 2021/22. You should already have these from my 2 previous newsletters but it doesn't hurt to have them again just in case!

## Art Week

Art week started on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> June and runs for the whole week. This year the focus is around The National Gallery's Take One Picture. Each year the Gallery invites primary schools nationwide to focus on one of its paintings and respond creatively to its themes and subject matter, historical context, or composition. The programme aims to put art at the centre of children's learning across the curriculum, inspiring a lifelong connection with artists' work, museums and galleries. This year the National Gallery has selected The Battle of San Romano (painted probably about 1438– 40) by Paolo Uccello as the source of inspiration. Last week our children took part last week in online workshops about the painting with the National Gallery so they may be able to tell you something about it already. Acorn and Conker have got slightly muddled with the weeks and they started Art Week last week so they're ahead of the rest of the school although they will be continuing with their art work into this week as well.

#### School Streets – 8.30am to 9.30am & 3pm to 4pm

I have now been contacted by residents that live on both Worsley Road and Elsham Road who are concerned that our children and some parents don't appear to realise that anyone that is resident in these streets can drive in and out of their road at any time of the day and are exempt from the School Streets times. Some of our children have not been aware of traffic as it drives down and are in the middle of the roads oblivious to what is around them which makes them very unsafe.

Please can you make sure that your children are on the path when walking to and from school and if they are riding bikes in the road they are still using the same amount of vigilance as they would on any other road. The same goes for children crossing the roads, please remind them to always check both ways before they cross. We will also be reminding the children in school.

#### School Uniform

Your child does not need to wear uniform with our logo on it and you can buy our uniform in the correct colours from most supermarkets.

## PE Uniform

In September we are going to keep the practice of children coming to school in their PE kits on the days they have PE. This is black or blue shorts, plain white T-shirt and a navy blue tracksuit. ## Parentpay and Dinner Money

We are getting near to the end of the school year and we need to clear some of the dinner money debt on Parentpay before we break up. Can you please check your account to see that you are up to date. Dinner money is  $\pounds 11.50$  a week if your child has a school dinner every day.

If you leave Year 6 in debt then your child's Secondary school, if using the same payment system, will not allow you to add any money to your child's account until the debt is cleared with us.
