Maths



Year 6 mathematicians will:

- Compare and order fractions
- Use common factors to simplify fractions
- Recall and use equivalences between simple fractions, decimals and percentages, including different contexts
- Draw 2D shapes using given dimensions and angles.
- Calculate, estimate and compare volume of cubes and cuboids using standard units, including cm3 and m3, and extending to other units such as mm3 and km3.

English



Year 6 authors will:

- Work with William Shakespeare's Romeo & Juliet. They will spend a week working with Anthony Glenn to prepare a performance which will take place on Thursday 12th November.
- Write their own Viking myths and legends.
- Continue to work on the structure of their writing for different genres and contexts.
- Use other tenses, including the perfect tense.
- Use more complex punctation including hyphens and dashes.
