



## **'Engage – Inspire – Empower' Head Teacher Newsletter** November 2022

I hope you all had a good half term break and welcome back to the second half of the Autumn term where already the children are hard at work on their new topics.

I was looking at my newsletter that was written a year ago and we were still having to take lots of precautions because of covid including not letting parents into school to see their child's POWer project, attend a performance or be able to put on a Christmas Bazaar. It is fantastic that we are now able to do all of those things.

One of the things I would like to bring back as well is for parents in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to come in and read with their children every Thursday morning starting this week. You are invited to come in with your child and read with them until 9.15am when the teachers will take the class register. This means if you come in at 8.55am you will have 20 minutes in the class and if you have children in more than one class you will be able to spend time in each classroom. (Reception and Year 1 parents will be able to leave by the Reception playground gate and Year 2 can leave through the front entrance as the playground gates will be closed at 9.05am as usual). We know that not all parents will be able to come in and read but don't worry as your child carry their friends, with the teacher, support staff or with another parent. It does mean as well that as it's a Thursday morning you will be able to help your child carry their POWer projects into class and the last Thursday of every half term you will be able to look at the POWer projects in your child's class instead of reading. We look forward to seeing you in class when you can.

### What's new in school?

We now have an incredible history timeline that starts with the Stone Age in 10,000 BC and ends with King Charles III and me! (Yes I really have been here that long that I make the timeline. In fact next year I will have been Head of Jenny Hammond for 20 years and it really has been a privilege). The timeline sweeps around the walls downstairs in the Victorian building and you can see photos of it under our History curriculum on our website. You will also be able to see it when you come in and read with your children.

To celebrate Black History Month the children took part in an assembly and workshops with Bigfoot Theatre Company called 'Hidden Figures.' The children learned about significant black people that aren't always recognised for their contribution to the way we live today. To recognise those significant people the artist, Sally Newton who painted our History timeline, is coming back to add them onto our wall so that they are recognised and known. Ask the children if they can remember who they learned about.

Finally as well, and I had been meaning to do this for the last couple of years, we have had the Victorian staircase refurbished and it now looks beautiful covered in a gorgeous Victorian red lino that doesn't look like anything like how I remember lino looked back in the 70s that's for sure.

### Book Fair

We are having a Book Fair again this half term starting on **Thursday 3rd November** and running until **Wednesday 9th November** where you will have an opportunity <u>after school</u> to buy books for



your children. From the money we take at Book Fair we are able to take a percentage of the total in books for our classroom collections. The book fair will be held in **The Hall** opening from <u>3.15pm to</u> <u>3.45pm each day</u>. We can't take cards unfortunately but we do have a QR code you can scan to pay if you have your banking details on your phone. I am running it this year and I look forward to seeing lots of you there as there are some brilliant books for sale which will make a great gift for your child.

# Anti-Bullying Week Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November to Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November – 'Reach Out'

The theme of Reach Out came about following consultation with teachers and pupils by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which coordinates Anti-Bullying Week every year in England and Wales. Teachers and children wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

Following the success of the campaign in 2021 – when 80% of schools marked the week, reaching over 7.5 million children and young people – Anti-Bullying Week will remind everyone whether it's in school, at home, in the community or online, let's reach out and show each other the support we need.

Odd Socks Day marks the start of Anti-Bullying Week taking place on Monday 14th November. We will celebrate what makes us all unique and spread kindness! Children can come to school in their odd socks and school uniform please.

Throughout the rest of the week we will be doing different activities around anti bullying including an online theatre workshop called 'Hope' and our Unicef Ambassadors will be out and about in the playground at playtimes and lunchtimes playing with the children and supporting the children in their friendships and play.

### Christmas Bazaar

We did not hold a Christmas Bazaar last year but this year it is back on <u>Friday 9th December</u> at 3pm to 5.30pm. It will take place in the Year 5 and 6 block, the Hall and we are hoping for a special visitor who will be in The Lodge waiting to hear the children's Christmas wishes whilst I'll be looking after the reindeer!

To enable staff to get ready for the Bazaar our Chair of Governors has agreed for school to <u>finish early</u> on the 9<sup>th</sup> December at 2pm. Gates will open for you to collect your child at 1.50pm. If your child goes to Early Rise after school club then they will be looked after as usual until the club ends at 5.30pm however because we are using The Lodge, the After School Club will be in the main building and children should be collected from the main entrance.

If you can't pick up your child at 2pm then please let us know and we will make arrangements for your child to be looked after.

To support one of our tombola stalls at our bazaar we are holding a non-uniform day on Friday  $25^{th}$ November. We are asking the children to come to school in non-uniform in return for bring in a full bottle for our Bottle Tombola. It can include any drinks and can include alcohol but please hand this into the school office rather than your child carrying it in. We are also holding a non-uniform day on Friday  $2^{nd}$  December where we are asking the children to bring in chocolate, sweets or treats for out Treats Tombola.

We are also in need of raffle prizes so if you have any connections with shops, organisations or companies that can donate a raffle prize we would be very grateful. We are not collecting bric a brac for the bazaar as we won't be having a stall due to space.
